Halloween can be traced back to an ancient Celtic festival called Samhain (pronounced sah-win). The Celts lived in what is now known as Ireland, Scotland, and Wales over 2,000 years ago. Samhain marked the end of the harvest season and the beginning of winter.

During Samhain, the Celts believed that the boundary between the human world and the spirit world became thin. They thought that on this night, the spirits of the dead returned to Earth to cause mischief. To ward off these spirits, the Celts would light bonfires and wear masks and costumes.



As the Roman Empire expanded, their traditions mixed with those of the Celtic festival. The Romans celebrated the festival of Feralia when they honoured their dead and Pomona, which honored the goddess of fruit and trees. It is thought that the halloween game of bobbing for apples originated from this festival.
