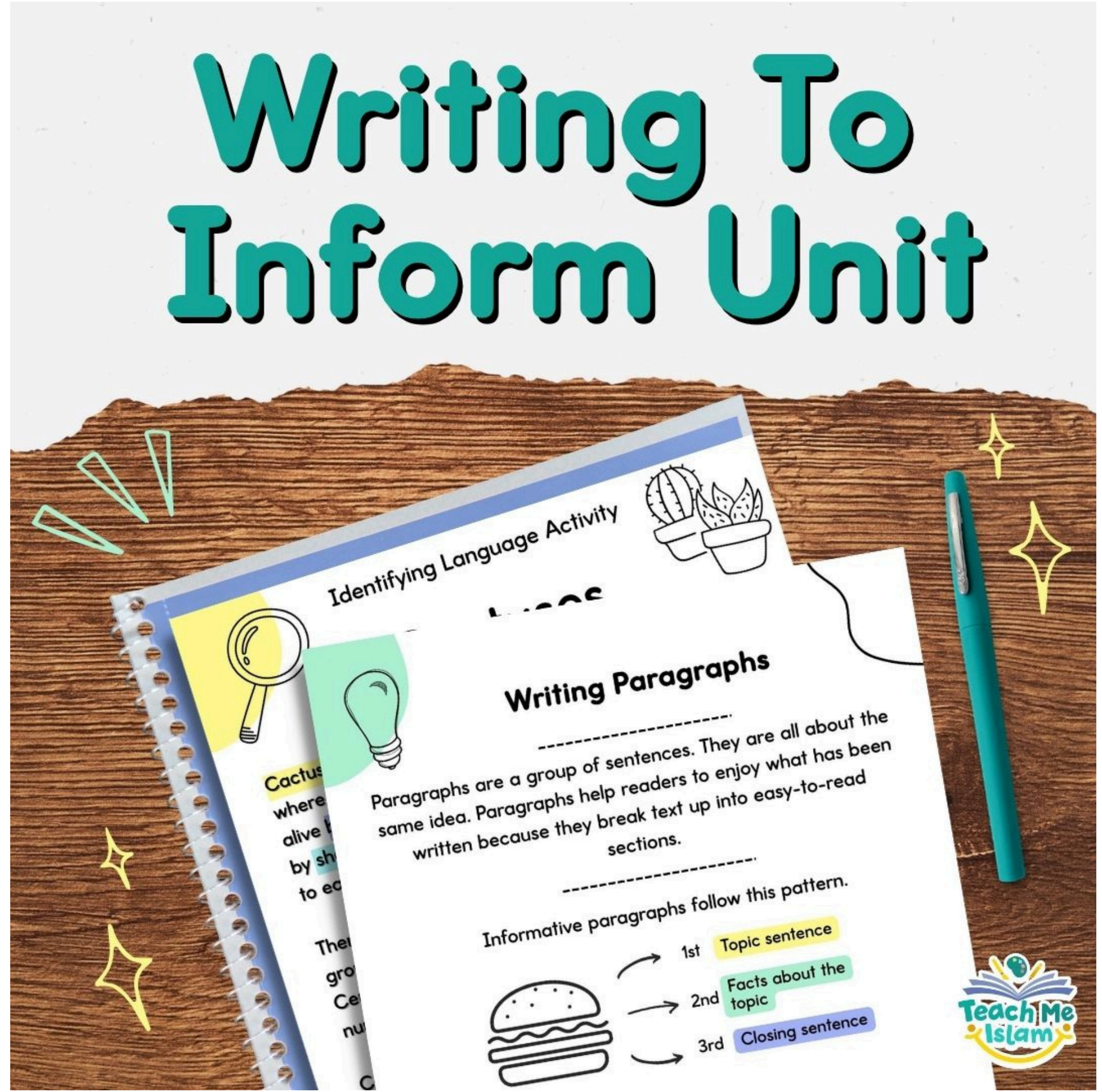

Informational texts have 3 parts. In the same way a burger needs two pieces of bread and filling, an informative text needs an introduction, description and a conclusion.

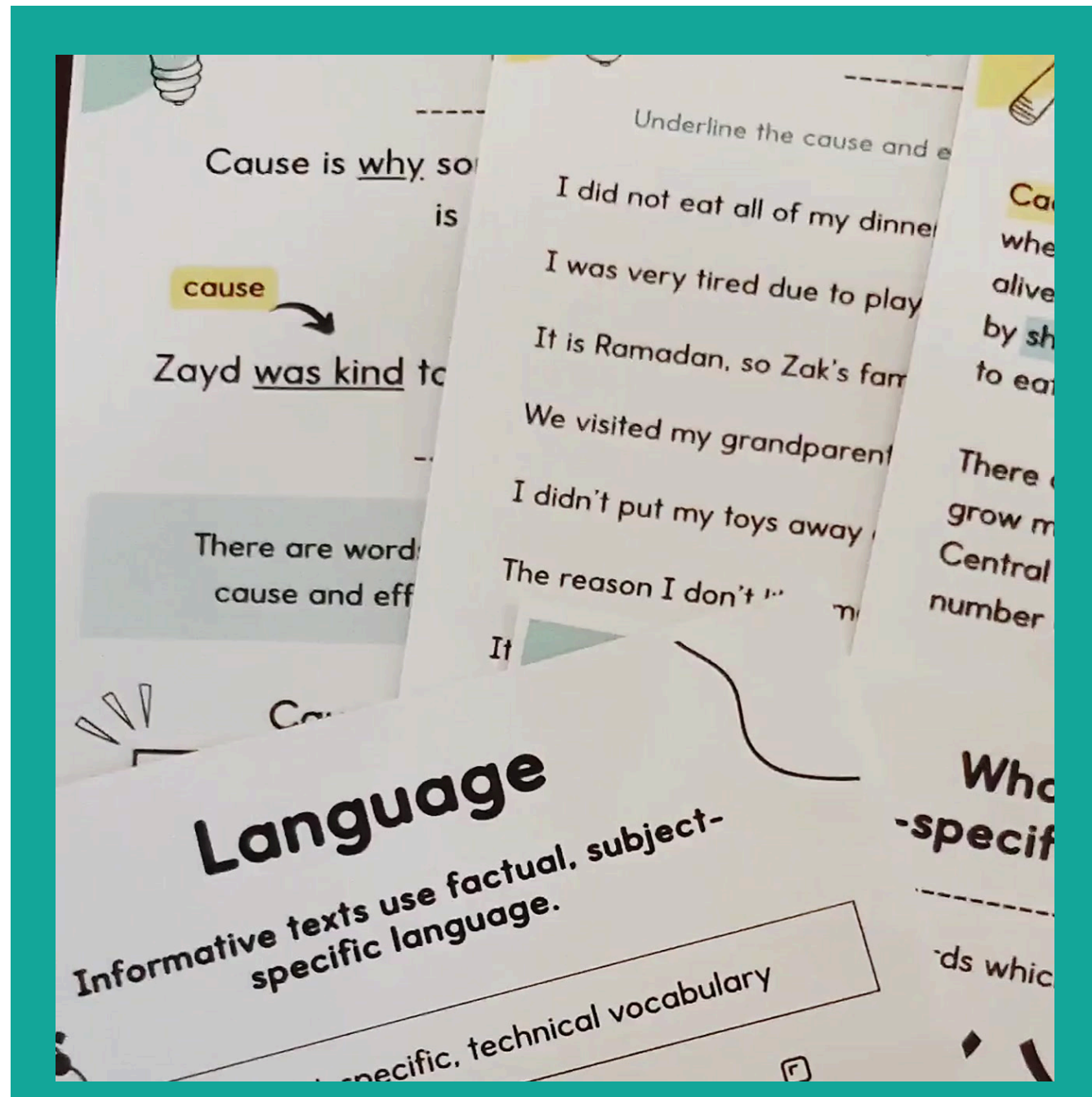
- 1st Introduction
